
Introduction - Society For Islamic Education (S53286/86-87), a Non Profit Registered Organization was formed aiming to promote Science and Secular education by establishing Educational Institutions as under Art. 30 of the Constitution of India. **Sishu Bikash Academy**, the brain child of this society, came into existence in the year 1985 at Nursery level at Chakberia-Mokrapur More, P.O. Kustia, P.S. Sonarpur, Dist. South 24 Parganas. Gradually the school was upgraded to class XII level.. The school obtained recognition as a Self-Managed Co-educational School with Primary, Secondary & Higher Secondary Section (Arts, Science, Commerce) by the Education Departments, Govt. of West Bengal. Recognition Code C1-426 for SE & Code 02321 for HS. It is a residential school having well-managed hostel for boys and girls for all sections. The school maintains strict secular fabric by way of admitting students irrespective of caste, sex and religion. The school obtained Minority Status Certificate under Article 30 of the Constitution Of India on 21.11.2007 by the National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, Govt. of India.

Sishu Bikash College Of Education came into existence under the patronage of **Society For Islamic Education** in the year 2010 as a recognized B. Ed College by the NCTE with affiliation from the University of Calcutta. It is situated just by the side of our school premises on Plot No. - LR 198 under Khatian LR 528 of Mouza 106 Mokrapur. The college has got its own building having a good infrastructure and a picturesque garden. The lovely playground is an extra attention. The college began functioning with effect from the 23rd day of August, 2010 which is marked as a Red-letter day in the history of Society For Islamic Education. The college obtained **Minority Status Certificate** under **Art 30 of The Constitution of India** on 08.04.2013 by **National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions, Govt. of India.**

As per revised order (2014) of the NCTE the B. Ed. course of our college has been extended to 2 years with 2 units (Per unit 50) with 100 intakes. With the introduction of a new University for Teachers' Training Programme namely **The West Bengal University of Teachers' Training, Education Planning & Administration** having its office at 25/2 & 25/3, Ballygunge Circular Road, Kolkata - 700019, we have become the natural affiliating member of this University from the academic session : 2016 - 18.

Location

The college stands by the road side (SD-3 Bus route) at Village Chakberia-Mokrapur More which is 8 kilometer east of Sonarpur P.S. Railway Station and 3 kilometers North East of Champahati Railway Station. Trains and Buses are easily available to reach the college.



Mission

This College has taken teacher's education a mission to enlighten the school-student with newer ideas through these teacher educators and continuous updating of knowledge and use of modern technology in teacher Education with enhancement of capability through pursuits of higher knowledge have been the mission of the College. The college intends to provide quality teacher education for developing understanding about various techniques of evaluation recently introduced by Board/Council and their practical classroom application and also for enhancing the professional competencies of teaching subjects of their specialization.

Infrastructure

Building: The college has got two multi storied buildings side by side situated at a lovely place far away from noisy town, having spacious rooms for holding Theoretical and Practical Classes, Laboratory Works, Reading Room, Resource Room with well stocked library and separate common room for male and female students.

Library: The library is equipped with adequate number of books. The library has periodicals and journals, separate reference section, journal section and reading room. Seating capacity of the reading room of the library is more than 100.

Psychology Laboratory: The college has a psychology laboratory which provides practical training to the student teacher. The laboratory has many testing apparatus to assess intelligence, aptitude, creativity and many other personality tests of individuals.

Computer Laboratory: The college has computer laboratory with appropriate hardware and software to provide training of the trainee as well as in-service education to the teacher and administrators. Internet and e-mail service are provided for the benefit of the students and faculty members.

Language laboratory: The language laboratory of the college has a good collection of language development materials and tests. Spoken English programme is also offered to the students through this laboratory.

Physical Science Laboratory: The physical science laboratory of college comprises with two separate laboratories in Chemistry and Physics. The Chemistry laboratory is well equipped with apparatus and chemical reagents to perform all type of tests covering the Secondary and Higher Secondary Syllabus. The Physical laboratory on the other hand well is also furnished.

Life Science Laboratory: Life science laboratory is well equipped with the dissecting trays and boxes, a good number of compound Microscope, etc for providing all facilities for experiments in Life science. All the arrangements are meant for conducting, demonstration of laboratory practical in our B.Ed course. Moreover the laboratory is enriched with many preserved museum specimens, chart and models.

Geography Laboratory: The Geography laboratory of this college is decorated with model, picture and others instruments like tracing table, barometer etc. for providing all facilities for conducting, demonstration of laboratory practical of our B.Ed courses.

Work Education Workshop: The college provides a completely separate workshop for conducting both outdoor and indoor projects. Our workshop is spacious, airy and well equipped with upto date apparatus and all types of chemicals and reagents for performing all the project works of our courses.

Publication: College published a Wall Magazine and Annual Magazine.

Sports Facilities: The college encourages popular sporting activities including Football, Cricket, Volleyball, Khoko and other co-curricular activities. Admission Modalities

The Academic sub committee formulates rules for admission following the guidelines of WBUTTEPA and N.C.T.E.

Intake : There shall be 100 students divided into two sections of 50 students each for general session and not more than 25 students per teacher for a school subject for methods courses and other practical activities of the programme to facilitate teaching and learning.

Eligibility: (1) Candidates with atleast 50% Marks either in Bachelor's Degree (General or Advanced level in Hons.) and / or in the Master's Degree are eligible to apply for admission to the programme. They must have atleast two subjects at the degree level of the following : Beng, Eng, Edn, Geo, Hist., Life Science (Zoology / Botany / Physiology) Math, Physical Science (Physics / Chemistry), Arabic.

(2) Application forms will not be sent by Post. Candidate will be required to collect Admission Form and Prospectus from college office on payment of Rs. 300/- on all working days between 11 a.m. to 3.30 p.m. on production of marksheet of degree / PG level in original.

(3) Application forms not duly filled in and not accompanied by photo copies of certificates, Marksheets and other relevant papers will not be considered.

(4) A merit list of candidates for admission into B. Ed. course will be displayed on college notice board. Listed candidates will have to appear for counselling. No intimation letter will be sent to the individual candidates.

(6) Selection of intakes in different subjects will be made on the basis of quota in each subject, to be decided by the selection committee of the college.

Approved graduate teachers (IX to XII) deputed by the recognized secondary schools of WB are eligible for admission and be exempted from age bar & subject merit.

(7) **List of Method Subject with code :** Bengali (BNGS), English (ENGS), Arabic (ARBS), Math (MTMS), Ph. Sci (PHYS), L. Sci (LFSS), Hist (HISS), Geo (GEOS), Education (EDCS).

Hostel : The college has its own Hostel. Willing students may stay at hostel.

Cancellation of Admission : (a) Admission is liable to be cancelled at any stage for non-fulfillment of eligibility criteria, error in information, misconduct, indiscipline and violation of rules. The college will not be responsible for cancellation of admission.

(b) If any student remains absent from classes continuously for 15 days or intermittently for 30 days within the first two months from the date of his/her admission, his/her name will be struck off the rolls and **fees submitted by the student at the time of admission will be forfeited.**

Withdrawal : No refund will be made in case of withdrawal of admission.

Priority in Admission :-

In admission of students priority shall be given to the eligible candidates of **Minority / SC / ST / PWD.**

Hostel Facilities:-

- a] Limited hostel accommodation are available separately for boys and girls having residence in distant places.
- b] Student seeking hostel accommodation should submit another application obtainable from the College office.
- c] Priority shall be given to eligible Minority students as per existing Rules.

Rules for Collegiate/Non-Collegiate/Discollegiate categories:-

- a] Selected candidates are directed to attend their classes from the beginning of the session otherwise they will miss the percentage of class attendance.
- b] **Collegiate Candidate:-** Students are required to attend at least 75% of the total lectures delivered by teachers in the session to complete the course.
- c] **Non-Collegiate Candidate:-** The candidate whose percentage of class attendance is less than 75% but above 60% of the total number of lectures delivered in the session will be treated as non-collegiate candidate. They may be allowed to sit for the examination (to the shortage in the percentage of class attendance if conditioned by the appropriate authorities.) as per existing rules.
- d] **Discollegiate Candidate: -** The candidates whose percentage of class attendance fall below 60% of the total number of lectures delivered in the session will be treated as discollegiate candidates. They are not eligible to appear at the university examination.

Admission Procedure

Admission shall be made on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examinations followed by counselling. The selection made by the selection committee will be final. All selected candidates will have to produce original certificates at the time of counselling. .

DOCUMENTS TO BE SUBMITTED AT THE TIME OF THE ADMISSION

1. A declaration by the student to abide by the rules and norms of the college.
2. 12 recent passport size photographs.
3. Two attested copies of all documents.
4. Original College leaving certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
5. Migration Certificate (in original) for a migrating student.
6. M. C. Resulation countersigned by the D. I. of Schools (SE) (for Deputed Candidate).

Migration from Other University

Candidates from other Universities are to submit migration Certificates from their respective Universities within one month from the commencement of the session failing which he/she will be liable to pay late fine as specified by the University.

NB. (Total fees to be deposited at the time of admission and fees once paid are not refundable.)

Rules

1. Insubordination and unbecoming language or conducts in any form are sufficient reason for dismissal of a student.
2. Appearing in the Test Examination will be compulsory for sent up for the final B.Ed. Examination.
3. Deputed candidates can enjoy C.L. or M.L. as per Govt. rules. If the leaves exceed, It will be informed to the head of the institution from which he/she is deputed.
